TAX BENEFITS

Your solicitor can provide information about the positive effects of leaving a donation in your Will on the inheritance tax due on your estate.

At present, all legacies to charities are free from inheritance tax and by leaving at least 10% of your estate to charity can reduce your overall inheritance tax bill from 40% to 36% (if your estate is taxable which depends on various circumstances).

HOW TO LEAVE A GIFT IN YOUR WILL

To remember Leeds Playhouse in your Will, a short paragraph, or clause can be added when your Will is being prepared. If you want to add Leeds Playhouse to your existing Will, your solicitor simply attaches a written instruction, called a codicil. This should be done by your solicitor as you may inadvertently invalidate your Will if you make the changes yourself.

If you have not yet made a
Will, it is advisable to make an
appointment with a solicitor.
Without one, you are not in
control of what happens to your
assets. If you do not have a
solicitor, you could ask a family
member or friend to suggest one.

There are three main ways you may wish to consider a bequest to Leeds Playhouse or you can leave a combination of the three.

- Residuary bequest

A Gift made of what is left of your estate after all other Gifts have been handed out and debts paid off. To do this you may leave either the total of the residue or a percentage.

Pecuniary bequest A Gift made of a fixed sum of money

- Specific bequest

A particular named item left as a Gift in your Will. For example, a piece of jewellery, furniture or a painting
