A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR, MARK ROSENBLATT...

I've wanted to direct Richard III for a long time. It's a dark comedy in which the main character is a crazily ambitious, murderous liar who'd kill his whole family to get what he wants. It's also a strange psychodrama, full of ghosts and dreams and night-visions, which asks the question: how far can you go before your conscience gets in the way?

There are so many contemporary political regimes who have taken power after bloody conflicts, so many terrible crimes committed just to achieve power. In Richard III we have a family, fresh from the War of The Roses, trying to enjoy their new-found power, secretly riddled by guilt and trying to ignore the blood on their hands.

This mixture of comedy, feverish guilt and contemporary resonance make it an exciting play to put on the Quarry stage. My production will be a mixture in itself modern, with lots of contemporary elements, but medieval in its brutality, rage and sense of religious fear.

Taking place in our Quarry theatre, discover how the production of Richard III went from page to stage in this insightful and interactive session. Led by director Mark Rosenblatt and accompanied by cast members, students will observe a practical demonstration of key moments from the production. This session is specifically planned to enhance students' understanding of the creative process undertaken to stage a production and help them develop a deeper understanding of the role of a director; interpreting text and relationships between key characters.
